
12.2 million people are estimated to be in need of assistance in Syria, including more than **7.6 million** internally displaced persons (IDPs).

NOTE: UNHCR refugee figures combine those registered and awaiting registration. Government officials estimate the number of Syrians in their countries to be higher than the UNHCR figures.

Significant numbers of Syrian refugees who are not in camps in Turkey are in the provinces of Istanbul, Izmir, Konya, Ankara and Bursa. This population is not depicted on the map. Numbers are included in the chart.
